

NILOAK & BEYOND 20TH-CENTURY AMERICAN SWIRL ART POTTERY

ABOUT HISTORIC CANE HILL

Historic Cane Hill, Inc. is a 501 (c)3 non-profit organization. Historic Cane Hill is a place for people of all ages to connect with history, arts, Ozarks culture, and the natural world through tours, public programs, and museum and gallery exhibitions. Since 2013, Historic Cane Hill has preserved some of the region's most important character-defining landmarks, including the 1886 Cane Hill College building and the 1891 Cane Hill Presbyterian Church. Cane Hill is home to trails, natural features, orchards, and 18 historic buildings and sites listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Cane Hill is where momentous historic events, arts, education, agriculture, and the natural environment intersect. Nestled in the Ozark Mountains, it is the site of the oldest permanent settlement in Washington County (1827), one of Arkansas's first institutions of higher learning (1850), and the first co-ed college in the state.
