## **ABOUT HISTORIC CANE HILL**

Historic Cane Hill, Inc., is a non-profit organization dedicated to the preservation of the historically significant structures of Canehill, Arkansas, as well as western Washington County. This includes the many small communities around present-day Canehill.

Historic Cane Hill seeks to build upon the legacies of architecture, education, and the arts by providing programs and a venue to experience art and culture rooted in the history of the region and the beautiful natural surroundings of the Ozark Mountains.

Located just off Hwy. 45, 20 miles west of Fayetteville, and 41 miles east of Tahlequah, Oklahoma, this historicallysignificant area is nestled in the beautiful Ozark Mountains. Visitors enjoy more than 100 acres of pristine Ozark trails, orchards, and landscape, along with 14 historic buildings. The on-site museum and gallery showcase more than 1000 community artifacts and heirlooms as well as rotating special exhibitions and are open Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. **HISTORIC CANE HILL** is thrilled to showcase, for the 6th year, the incredible talents of high school students from across Arkansas. The Arkansas High School Art Competition and Exhibition gives many students their first chance to be featured in a juried show.




